

Interpretive Communication – Listening Comprehension

The National Spanish Examinations assess Interpretive Communication in Listening Comprehension. The student is given (1) a context in English, (2) an authentic spoken passage in Spanish and (3) a question based on one of the learner outcomes below and then followed by four answer choices. The learner outcomes increase in difficulty as the student progresses to higher levels.

Authentic texts are spoken passages that have been produced by and for native speakers for a culturally authentic purpose.

Examples of authentic oral spoken passages used on the National Spanish Examinations:

- A **conversation**
- A **description**
- An **announcement**
- A set of **instructions / directions**
- A **film** or **video** clip
- An **excerpt** or **passage** from
 - a news bulletin
 - a radio broadcast
 - a speech
 - an article, a letter
 - an essay, a magazine
 - a book or novel

 - an editorial
 - a short story
 - a poem
 - a legend
 - a fable
