# **2023 Scholarships for Teachers to Travel to Guatemala with the *Pulsera Project***

*The National Spanish Examinations (NSE), a program of the American Association of Teachers of Spanish and Portuguese (AATSP), is committed to providing teachers with opportunities to continue their professional development. To this end, NSE is offering one scholarship for Teacher Travel to Guatemala. The scholarship is provided through our collaboration with The Pulsera Project / Color the World and will include excursions to Antigua, Quetzaltenango, and Panajachel. Food, lodging, local transportation, and insurance are all included. In addition, a stipend of \$400.00 will be given to help offset airfare cost.*

### ELIGIBILITY

For the 2023 stipend, applicants MUST:

- Be a current member of the AATSP.
- Be registered to administer the online National Spanish Exam, National Spanish Challenge, National Spanish Assessments or National Portuguese Exam in 2022-2023.
- Have administered at least *one* of the following exams in the 2020-2021 OR 2021-2022 academic year: National Spanish Exam, National Spanish Challenge, National Spanish Assessments or National Portuguese Exam.
- Be a full-time Spanish or Portuguese teacher in a public, private or parochial school for the 2022-2023 academic year.
- Have a minimum of 1 year of teaching experience.

### COMMITMENT

Applicants must commit to participate in the one-week study abroad program in Guatemala July 12-20, 2023, as outlined in the itinerary. In order to prove acceptance of the scholarship, the winning teacher will be expected to create a short bio, along with a photo, and submit confirmation to: [nse@aatsp.org](mailto:nse@aatsp.org).

*Applicants should be aware that vaccinations (COVID and others) for international travel may be required as well as additional COVID testing.*

## **REQUIREMENTS**

1. Winners must attend the entire trip to Guatemala.
2. Winners must secure their own transportation and submit confirmation to [nse@aatsp.org](mailto:nse@aatsp.org).
3. If the winner cannot attend the entire scholarship program, the trip will be forfeited and another applicant will be chosen. *This award may not be postponed to another year.*
4. Upon return from Guatemala, recipients agree to send an account of their experiences, such as via an online blog (journal and digital photographs and/or videos), to [nse@aatsp.org](mailto:nse@aatsp.org) to be shared with the staff of the NSE / AATSP as well as Pulsera Project and to be published on the NSE website. *This account must include several digital photographs (and/or videos) to be published on the NSE/AATSP websites and can be submitted via email, google form, or link to an online blog/video log.*

## **SELECTION and PAYMENT OF SCHOLARSHIP**

All applications must be postmarked by January 8, 2023. The proposals will be reviewed in early February and the recipient will be notified by February 11, 2023. Applicants agree to sign the required liability forms and travel at their own risk as well as pay any costs not included as mentioned above. The winning applicant will be given Professional Development credit upon proof of successful completion of the trip and scholarship requirements.

## **APPLICATION PROCEDURE**

1. **Fill out the application form:** [Guatemala Application Form](#).
2. **Provide a letter of recommendation** (File name: Applicant Name – Recommendation): Applicants must attach to the application form one (1) letter of recommendation on official letterhead from a qualified person who can speak for the applicant's ability to be successful in completing a study abroad experience.
3. **Provide a resume or (CV) curriculum vitae** (File name: Applicant Name – Resume/CV): Applicants must attach to the application form either a resume or curriculum vitae.
